#### INTRODUCTION

#### a) Organization:

In the year 1986, the Church's Auxiliary for Social Action (CASA) initiated the development activities in Bheluadanga under Development Programme in NORTH EAST India in cooperation with North bank Baptist Christian Association NBBCA. As a apart of te process, a District Level Committee was formed to plan and implement the development activities within 21 selected villages. Through the process of development, the district level committee promoted as full-fledged organization by acquiring the legal status in the name of DISTRICT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME" (DCDP). In the year 1997-98 to carry forward the process of development activities with the objectives framed in the constitution. At present since 2015 the organization is connected as Development wings of Sonitpur Baptist Christian Association.

**VISION:-** The DISTRICT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME" (DCDP). Visualizes a society where all citizens irrespective of caste, creed and color live together with peace justice, harmony and equality. The DCDP strongly envisages a society where poor, marginalized and under privilege have equal opportunities for their active involvement in the development process, which is value based.

**MISSION:-** The DCDP actively involves toward a sustainable society by creation a condition for active and meaningful involvement of people and their organization in the sustainable development process. The DCDP also respond to emergencies and disasters and enhance people's capacity for disaster mitigation.

#### Area of Operation:-

Due to lack of Financial resource the intensive action area is stretched in 10 villages encompassing 2 Blocks in the District of Sonitpur now it is Biswanath. It has a wide networking through the District with Bheluadanga under the Chaiduar Development Block of Gohpur Sub Division and the Baghmari Development Block of Biswanath Sub Division.

#### **BACKGROUND**

District Community Development Programme, DCDP Bheluadanga has been very actively involving in the socio-economic development for the community those who are economically and politically exploited. The organization very deeply understands the condition of the poorest of the poor, marginalized and downtrodden. The organization has been playing a vital role in the socio-economic upliftment of the downtrodden poor people of these areas. So the organization realized very genuinely and prepared an assessment and detailed the documentation to SEVA BHARAT Guwahati to provide support towards the upliftment of these communities especially in its operation areas. As per the request of the organization SEVA BHARAT/ Letha Charitable Trust indirectly provided support towards Adult Literacy Programme and Children Development Programme. The organization has been struggling against the different issues and problems of the society as well as the environment under the district of Sonitpur Assam.

Besides above, DCDP in a process to cover the fringe villages of border area of 6<sup>th</sup> addition of Kaziranga National Park like Gopal Jaroni, Thute Sapori, Toltoli and Dath kola and approached to department of Science and Technology, Government of India through WWF-India, New Delhi under the project title of Economic Empowerment of Rural Fringe Communities of KNP in Biswanath District, Assam.

The organization had implemented different activities, through these activities and trying to formulate a healthy atmosphere in the society.

#### b) The Project:-

The Community Based Food Security Programme (CBFS) was a unique project of **DCDP** for last 10 years supported by Church's Auxiliary for social Action CASA to address the basic needs towards the socio-economic development in selected **47** villages under in two pocket areas Bheluadanga and Selaikhati respectively in Gohpur Sub-Division and Biswanath Sub-Division in the District of Sonitpur in Assam. As the said project completed in September 2015 and though there are no linkages for financial resources DCDP continued to work with the challenges underlining the Goal and Programme objectives.

During the year 2018 also DCDP submitted application in continuation with socio-economic survey data to SEVA BHARAT and approached for 5 Adult Literacy Centre and 5 Children Development Programme Centre specifically for 10 selected villages under Chaiduar Block in Sonitpur (Presently Biswanath) district of Assam. Besides the above Programmes DCDP is also trying to address the issues relating to Food Security, Environment, Women and Gender.

For better implementation of the project and activity DCDP segregated the work with following Components.

#### 1. Community Development

#### 2. Capacity Building

According to the above components DCDP has involved with the community and mobilized human resources who have been serving voluntarily with minimum honorarium for the community at their respective area. The details of the activity are narrated in details below.

#### 1. Community Development:

he community Development Programme is a process that is designed to create a condition of sustainable approach through Socio-Economic development for the community. The organization shared information with community on various Government schemes and provided necessary guidance to apply them. The organization also deals with the issues related to common health. The organization shares preventive measures giants the various kinds of diseases often seen among the community. Moreover these components the organization I nitiates and facilitates the process of educating the poor people on PDS (Public distribution System), RTI (Right To Information), eliminating illiteracy, and promoting women and child health care.

#### **GOVERNING BOARD MEETING AND STRUCTURE:**

There are 13 members in the Governing Board comprising with Male 11 and Female 2 since 2015. The strategy to work with the community DCDP formed 18 village Development Committees in Chaiduar Block under Gohpur sub-division. But due to lack of resources and man power within the organization the Governing Board Meeting and also Village Meeting could not conduct as regular basis. Moreover to take some major and important decisions 2 Governing Board meeting was conducted and following decisions were taken for implementation of the work.

- 1. Decided to complete the construction work of construction of Individual Household Latrine under Public Health engineer department/ Sacha Bharat Mission (G) (SBM(G)).
- 2. Decided to undertake the Rice and motor distribution to the ICDS Centre as per the order copy of Social welfare department, Government of Assam in cooperation with Mr. Supratim Dutta who is ready to provide finance at his own cost.
- 3. Decided to continue and carry forward the Adult Literacy Programme and Children Development Programme supported by SEVA BHARAT through Guwahati regional office at 5+5 clustered villages through local Churches.
- 4. Resolution adopted to carry forward the work and update the organization legal status and promote sustainability of the organizational status. The Secretary and President entrusted to work out and implement the entire process accordingly.

The total amount for the project was Rs.49,81,578.00. The distribution programme was started on May 9<sup>th</sup> 2018 at Biswanath Chariali ICDS Project (Sonitpur) and Completed by 30<sup>th</sup> May 2018 at Khoirabari ICDS Project (Darrang). DCDP is grateful to all the Child Development Project Officers along with all the staffs of respective ICDS Project and workers of ICDS Centres for their active cooperation and support during the distribution. We also offered our thankfulness to Mr.



Supratim Dutta for his possible support and cooperation to make the distribution successful manner. We are also grateful to the Director of Social Welfare, Government of Assam as well as the Ministry for enabling the effort to the ground needs at 1059 AWCs where 30,094 Children of the age group 6 months to 3 years, 2,265 Severely Malnourished Children of the age group 6 months to 3 years and 13,155 Pregnant Women & Lactating Mothers were supported for 17 days feeding programme.

### 2. <u>Capacity Building</u> ADULT LITERACY PROGRAMME:

DCDP adopted 5 selected villages and initiate 5 Adult Literacy Programme to improve the educational status as well as to address the social issues. The Valedictory and inaugural function of Adult Literacy Programme was held on August 10<sup>th</sup> 2018 at DCDP Conference hall, Bheluadanga and the prepared agenda presided by Mr. Nathaniel Sinduri, Vice-Chairman, DCDP Governing Board where Mr. Agnesh



Basumatary District Coordinator of ALP, SEVA BHARAT and Dr Indranshee Das (Sub-Divisional Officer, Gohpur) attended in the Programme. There were 49 participants attended in inaugural function where the Village Headman and Social Worker Mr. Nagen Saikia are attended. The District Coordinator Mr. Agnesh Basumatary elaborated about the importance and guidelines of the Adult Literacy Programme. Through this Adult Literacy Programme DCDP as partner with SEVA BHARAT trying to bring changes from the present context through the following 5 components:

- 3. Immunization Definitation and importance, Vaccination for Children, adults and elderly
- 4. Pre-natal care Nutrition, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Months, Medication and Test
- 5. Post-natal care Mother, Child, Breast Feeding, Cleanliness, adequate sleep, Healthy work load, rest and Medication
- 6. Awareness of First Aid and Medicinal plants -

**First Aid**- Burns, Injuries, Drowning, Fever, Snake bite, Diarrhea, Vomiting, Fractures, Abdominal pain, Intoxication and bed ridden patients.

We believe that Children are the gift of God and created in the image of God. God created every individual person as a Child with dignity and with this statement our organization initiated with an small activity to educate children by bringing them together at one place at DCDP Campus and started practice how to read and write. Encouraging them to spent for some time in study of their secular

book after coming from the School. But lack of financial resources could not continue as long run however In the mean time DCDP acquired an opportunity to work in partnership with SEVA BHARAT for one year which is continuing since September 2018. At present there are 5

Children Development Centre's located in 5 different Villages in Halem revenue circle of Gohpur sub-Division in Sonitpur District (Presently Biswanath) of Assam. Sri Dipen Sinduri from Bheluadanga Village is supervising the 5 centre's as Club Manager of Child Development

Programme. The Centre's are located at Bheluadanga, Boroi and Halem. There are 219 children in 5 centre's comprising Adivashi, Nepali, Bengali, Muslim and Assamese community. Through SEVA BHARAT Games and Sports materials like Football, Ludu, Bed Mintan, etc were distributed in each centre's. There are 5 Club Leaders who are regularly from Monday to Friday in a week from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM taking care of these children as per their own routine. Besides taking care of the study they are teaching children on Dance, Singing, Storytelling, and educating on health and environment.
